## Chairman's Statement

It was fantastic to see so many club members at the end of season dinner and awards evening in September at the Harbour Hotel. I hope everybody enjoyed their evening as much as I did (once the dreaded speech was out of the way!). Thank you to Claire Mayne for her organisation of the event.

This chairs report is not going to reference the exciting on field cricket highlights as these are picked up in the Captain's reports.

I wanted to take this opportunity, in my last year as Chair of our awesome club, to highlight some of our collective and holistic success this year and to remind ourselves of the staggering achievement it is just to provide the scale of cricket opportunities that we do.

I think often, especially during difficult seasons, we can find ourselves bogged down in a focus on the performances and league placings of our senior teams and its worth reminding ourselves that whilst we all strive to win every match that we play, that this is not the only marker of a club's success.

Don't get me wrong, winning certainly makes the game an awful lot more fun and I know every player, coach and volunteer within the club (myself included) will share an ambition to compete at the highest level of club cricket that we can. I look forward to developing a clear vision and strategy over the winter with the incoming new committee on how we achieve this.

I wanted to share a few stats to highlight some of the overarching successes we've achieved this year that evidence the great place we are in as a community, volunteer run, cricket club and I'll throw in some thank-yous along the way.

We currently have over 430 registered club members aged from 5 to 80, plus another 200 parents and a host of past players and supporters who look upon the club fondly. We have an incredible reach across the Chichester region and beyond.

In the 2024 season, we have played 195 matches across all sections of the club and have provided training or a match on almost every day between late April and early September!

This amount of cricket means that we have had to use no fewer than 7 different 'home' venues for training and matches. This slightly nomadic nature does come with its challenges and is absolutely a priority for the club to secure a more permanent hub in Chichester that we can call home.

Unfortunately, our plans to develop the White Pavilion in Priory Park have been derailed, following a substantial effort and investment in developing exciting designs that we felt confident could achieve planning permission. Sadly, the scale of the building and the limited nature of use permissible, coupled with the lease terms offered by the Council, did not allow us the opportunity to generate the income required from the building to cover its operational costs, even if we had found the hundreds of thousands of pounds to build it. We continue to liaise with the Council, in an attempt to understand their long-term plan for supporting cricket in Priory Park and within Chichester more broadly and this does provide us an opportunity which is being investigated at the

new sports complex at Clay Lane, which includes a brand-new purpose-built pavilion and pitch. Our level of use and the sites management is being negotiated and determined over this coming winter.

Despite our facility challenges, we can celebrate a significant number of our training and matches being staged in glorious settings at Goodwood thanks to our unique and committed alliance with Goodwood Cricket Club and Goodwood Estate. A huge thankyou to Richard Geffen in that partnership and to the grounds crew he leads including Andy, Simon and Gary in keeping the ground in such great condition throughout the season.

We have run 4 senior league cricket teams and a midweek T20 Slam cricket team this season. A special thankyou to our four captains Sean, James, Graeme and Tim who have stoically led their teams this year through what can be described as an avalanche of challenges! I don't need to tell you how influential these 4 have been and will continue to be in our club's journey - If you cut them open, they bleed Chichester Priory Park Cricket Club.

I would also like to thank our team of umpires - Bryan, Boss, Mike, Bruce and our scorers - Cathy, Adam, Wes – we simply couldn't play without you.

Our women's cricket has continued to flourish this year with hardball and softball teams and an indoor winter team and a group of players that continue developing at rapid pace, whilst keeping an amazing sense of sportsmanship. Well done and thankyou to Sharon, Tim and Cathy for your leadership and work to make the club a welcoming place for women to play.

Without a doubt our junior set up remains the strongest in the area in terms of numbers, coaching quality and providing a pathway into playing senior cricket. We have provided mixed Junior Cricket at every age from 5 up to 18, which deserves a huge thankyou to the whole coaching team led by Sean, our parents who have taken on junior manager roles and the Friday night crew, including the fantastic bar team. We owe a lot of thanks to James' leadership of this section which directly results in our juniors enjoying a great summer.

We now also have girls only coaching available from age 8 upwards and competitive teams entered at u11 and u12 and are well on target with our plans to introduce a new age group each year, as the girls get older and progress through the pathway. This work has been superbly driven by Anna Davies and as a testament to her enthusiasm she has won the 'champion of girls cricket' award at the Sussex cricket collective awards!

Furthermore, we have outstanding relationships with our 8 club sponsors, whose investment has been paramount to delivering all that mentioned above. A huge thankyou to:

The shortlist for this year's Dyer Quaich award, awarded for an outstanding contribution to the club, included Lisa Rustell for her work over several years as our welfare officer and who is taking a well-deserved break from chasing many of you for your DBS forms! And a true unsung hero, Ben Hubbard for his hard work as treasurer, keeping an ever-watchful eye on our finances to ensure we are sustainable long into the future.

This year, the award winner is somebody who is stepping down from the committee having been so influential in our success for several years. She has minuted countless committee meetings and been an absolute superhero in the administration of our club, running events and managing our sponsor relationships so professionally that it's resulted in thousands of pounds of income generated. This has supported our growth in all areas, but particularly the Women's section that her and her husband Tim have been a driving force behind over several years since its reintroduction. To add to this, in recent years a lot of this work has been done whilst being on the other side of the world in Australia, getting far away from our winters! If this wasn't enough, she also gives up her Saturdays to score for the 1<sup>st</sup> XI throughout the summer. Our Dyer Quaich, club person of the year for 2024 is Cathy Gregory.

It's been really pleasing to have received so much feedback at the end of this season and it's clear that we have so many passionate and committed members. Seeing new people step forward to take on leadership and committee roles for next season leaves me really enthused for a bright future for CPPCC, consisting of fresh ideas and enthusiasm which can only build upon the strong foundations in place and propel the club forward on all fronts.

## Financial Report Summary

- The club recorded a surplus of £8,327, for the year which is around £6k higher than budget. The main differences vs budget are outlined below:
  - Increased membership contributions which is mainly due to the expanding girls / lady's section (£1.7k)
  - Inclusion of Care UK as a new sponsor (£1k)
  - Cessation of the White Pavilion project and release of provisions and additional rebate monies from CDC (£2.4k)
  - Lower cost for balls, which is mainly due to not fielding a men's 5XI and using existing stocks of balls from prior years (£0.9k)
- We made the decision to cease the White Pavilion refurbishment project. Despite the hard work of many, we were unable to agree lease terms with CDC which didn't place onerous ongoing financial obligation on the cricket club.
  - We are very grateful to Smith & Simmons and the Open Design Studio for their assistance with the project.
- We have been having discussions about the use of the Clay Lane facilities which are currently under construction.
- There is the possibility this might provide additional longer-term facilities for the club.
  - If discussions do progress, it is likely we might need to invest monies into developing ground infrastructure including sight screens, rollers, covers etc.
  - The surplus recorded this year will assist the club in pursuing this opportunity and funding required infrastructure.
- The club remains grateful to the Goodwood Estate and the Goodwood Cricket Club.
  - During the year we have invested in excess of £3k towards a motorised vehicle ("mule") and internet connections at Goodwood.
- The club has ample liquidity with around £45k in the bank.
- There are many individuals who give their time and expertise to the club to enable us to continue providing as much cricket as we can.
  - In the financial report, we wanted to give a special mention to Cathy Gregory. Cathy has done a fantastic job over the last 5-years in her capacity as Head of Fundraising and will be stepping down at the end of this year. Cathy's work in developing sponsorship revenue has been key to the club's strong financial position.
  - We are grateful to Claire Mayne for taking on this role for 2025.
- The support from the local business community through sponsorship is critical to the financial success of the club. Without their support, we would be unable to operate the club with our current subscription / match fee structure.
  - A special mention to our sponsors of Rathbones, George Ide, Goodwood Estate, Marchwood, Gardner and Scardifield, CI Optometrists, Todd Anstee & Care UK for their continued and very generous support.
- Finally, thanks to the committee and team captains for all their efforts this year.

## 1st XI - Season Report

In cricket as in life you need a bit of luck, and we got a truckload of it, unfortunately for us in 2024 none of it was good! Having had a couple of months to recover from the highs and lows of at a times a fairly torturous season, we can at least start a fresh with the bare minimum of third division cricket for our first eleven. In no way is coming 8th in this league good enough for a club of our size, relegation would have been a disaster and given our position and number of wins at halfway, we have to be grateful for small mercies.

The first game of the season, on a glorious summers day at Goodwood we were cruising against Pagham at 170/2, with Timmy 100 not out, a poor middle period with the bat and a below average bowling performance meant that we soundly beaten.

We lost again in week 2 at Littlehampton with arguably our worst performance of the season before getting off the mark against Findon who were soundly beaten after an excellent bowling display and ruthless chase. Unfortunately, by this point we had found out that our Overseas quick bowler Charlie Walters was injured and would be unable to bowl. Remember the luck I mentioned...he was quickly ruled out for the season and on a plane back to an operating theatre in Australia. He was a fantastic bloke and threw himself into his role off the pitch, hopefully we see him again and it's great to see that he's back on the field and taking wickets in warmer conditions back home.

Unfortunately, that win was an outlier and with the hangover of last season, low confidence and poor availability we lost the next five. Freddie Gillet playing with a broken finger took 5 fer against eventual champions Roffey and then unfortunately Hampshire realised what we already knew (that he's rather good) and picked him in their league winning academy side for the rest of the season. Our other fast bowling Academy all-rounder Harry Walker scored his maiden league fifty in that game but was unable to bowl due to injury. This limited him to only five overs during the season and a stress fracture of the back eventually led to him missing the last month completely. I have the utmost sympathy for Harry, incredibly talented and capable of bowling very fast, to lose a whole season at his age is tough but he showed resilience and a mental toughness that will stand him in good stead. I can only hope his luck changes and he can be let loose next summer!

Week 9...we won!!By this point TDB had returned after some sharp work by the Gregorys and defending 140 odd we bowled them out in a nerve jangler. Greggo was the star; he took 4 for 20 including two in the first three balls of the innings. The final catch by Fordy was the biggest relief against another decent side. TDB made a quite brilliant 131 against Pagham the following week including hitting their overseas into the middle of next week a couple of times, unfortunately we somehow managed to lose despite scoring 295.

We had two individual hundreds, and two five fers this season, all were in losing causes. They are match winning performances that should have given us an extra 60/70 points. Greggo took 6 for 13 against Billingshurst from 8.3 overs and yet we still managed to find a way to lose. Players were standing up with big performances but as a team we were letting the opposition off and that was incredibly frustrating and worrying. When Greggo flew home after week 10, he had just started hitting his straps, he's a great lad and one of my favourite stories of a young player coming through

at Chi. A lot of hard work and a steely mentality has made him into an excellent bowler, his status as a regular first grade cricketer in Perth is fully deserved.

Findon away was a huge win and with a bit of controversy thrown in, one that will live long in the memory. Young Dominic Ortlepp-Atkins made an excellent contribution in the run chase amongst other impressive innings, and he showed he has a big future.

From then on, we were just about in control of our destiny and some rain on days when we needed it meant we probably needed one win from our final two games. Middleton away on a cold dark horrible August day became my favourite day of the season. Big games require big men and when we needed him, we had the biggest. Fordys unbeaten 50 and a superb bowling performance led by Crooks meant we were safe with a week to spare.

On the players front, Timmy Wergan was rightly recognised with player of the season. Over 500 runs at a good rate with some outstanding innings was a great effort in a season of struggle. Andrew Crookham took the match winning performance with his four fer and 12\* in the big win against Middleton. Crooks had a tough first half of the season but came back in typical understated fashion with the ball to become our leading wicket taker, he deserves massive credit. Tom Baily's off spin was a potent weapon, and he also scored his maiden league fifty, he along with others had a huge amount asked of him this year. It's easy to forget how young he is, and this season will stand him in good stead. He along with Arran Goode, Dominic, Lewis Hawes, Harry and Freddie have the potential to form the core of a very good side. There really is nothing better than playing with your mates.

And now some thank yous, as most will be aware I'm moving away from the senior section. I'll still play wherever I'm needed and hopefully a move away from captaincy and administration will allow me to enjoy my veteran years as a club cricketer a bit more than I have recently.

It's time for new ideas, energy and enthusiasm from someone a bit younger and closer in age to the core playing group. A big well done to my fellow captains, it's been a horrible year, but we made it....just and, relatively argument free. To Richard and his grounds team who work tirelessly, the umpires, and in particular Cathy who has been wonderful, we are incredibly grateful.

The parents of our youngsters, who watch, drive, feed and clothe the teenage superstars with little thanks and sometimes the odd grunt, a huge thank you from me. To Hasto and the committee and to James who had to pull me and have a quiet word over a coffee after my Keegan esque rant at Goring. Nothing is possible without your hard work and dedication.

To the players, such a young talented group, thank you for your efforts and for having to perform under huge pressure at a young age. Stick together and get the club back where it belongs, it's over to you.

It's a great club and one we should all be proud of. Up the Chi.

## 2nd XI - Season Report

Firstly, big thanks to the Grounds Team at Goodwood, especially Gary Rustell who was very helpful on a number of occasions in a number of roles. Thanks to Boss for his umpiring and to Adam “Colesy” Coles for his impeccable scoring. Whatever the result Adam’s post-match analysis always brought great humour to group.

It was always going to be a challenging season for the 2s moving up to Division 4. With only two other second XIs in the league the standard is high. And with a third of the previous season’s team moving up the 1s there was very little strength in depth.

However, after 4 games, we had 3 wins! Lewis (who also took 5 wickets) and Ed Mac saw us home against Barns Green. A hundred from Rehan Meiring and another 50 for Lewis posted a big score at Burgess Hill. And then a surprising victory over runners up Ansty. This time it was Ed Mac and Dominic that took us home in a run chase.

Then two weeks of poor availability across the top 2 teams halted all momentum and we struggled from that point on. Going into the second half of the season it was apparent that 3 from 4 would be relegated and we needed 3 (maybe 2) wins to be safe. We got one when we beat a weakened Southwater team, but the damage was done in a home loss to Burgess Hill where we failed to defend a big score. A reverse to that result would have kept us up.

Despite some tough days there were plenty of positives. Team spirit was very good. The skipper tried to keep a lid on his emotions and succeeded more often than not. There was plenty of laughter after the games and the team stuck together throughout.

We awarded 3 blue caps. Ollie Greenlees for his 5 wickets at Broadwater, Matt Croker and Ed McCarthy for their hundreds against Southwater. Lewis Hawes batted beautifully on a number of occasions and his bowling got stronger as the season progressed. Finn Rustell at 16 was given a mammoth task of taking the new ball most weeks and had some really good spells. It was great seeing Ollie Greenlees enjoying his cricket again and Peter Lamb similarly had his best season for a few years. Adam Bardouveau was the team newcomer and did a great job behind the stumps and was always on hand to add humour where required. The emergence of Ollie Davies and Ewen Edwards towards the end of the season showed that there is talent coming through and I would expect both to figure more heavily next season.

The skipper led the bowling with 23 league and cup wickets, followed by Ollie Greenlees with 16, Fin with 15 and Stanley with 14. Nick Schurmann was a useful recruit early season and took 12 wickets. It was a shame he couldn’t play more. The batting was led by Matt Croker with 436 runs, Lamby with 366, Ed Mac 341 and 245 for Lewis. Adam had 9 wicket keeping dismissals and Stanley took 10 outfield catches.

Our 2s player goes to Matt Croker, an ever present in the team, a fine tally with the bat, useful overs when needed and one of our few competent fielders. Matt was part of the glue that kept the team together, hugely liked and respected by the team and a deserved winner.

I also have the pleasure of awarding the most improved. Jumping from Div 11 to Div 4 from one season is quite a leap. Doing that and then given the responsibility of the new ball without an experienced opening bowler the other end makes it especially difficult. I am not convinced the 'sink or swim' approach is necessarily the best approach for young cricketers, but you do learn the character of an individual very quickly. What Fin Rustell possesses beyond his undoubted skills is resilience and heaps of it. There were some good moments and tough moments, but he never shirked the challenge, played every game and was a key member of the team. He is our Most Improved Cricketer of the season.

There is so much I can share with you, but I will focus on three things. Firstly, the importance of Friday nights, secondly the ongoing development of our Juniors in senior cricket and finally what happens next.
