### **Chairman's Statement**

2022 has been my first year as club chair and what a year for cricket it was!

We played more matches across the club in 2022 than any year in recent memory. This was largely due to being such a scorcher of a summer where I don't recall a single week of nervously watching the weather forecast to see if we would be playing at the weekend.

Throughout the club's management committee, we aim to install an ethos of playing hard, competitive, and fair cricket. But beyond all else we want everybody involved in the club, in all capacities, to enjoy their time spent with Chichester Priory Park Cricket Club. Seeing players, officials, coaches and supporters at Goodwood, Priory Park and Keepers Green with smiles on their faces has been the most pleasing thing to see this summer. This was topped off by being able to bring everybody together to celebrate at the end of season awards evening in September.

2022 was a successful season for the club on the field. It's made me incredibly proud to see so many fantastic team and individual performances across the senior and junior sections.

The men's 1<sup>st</sup> XI finished 6<sup>th</sup>, in a very competitive league. 2022 saw the team banish batting nerves of years gone by, with the top order providing runs galore. Led by some brutal power hitting displays from Timmy Wergen, Mike Smith and Tom Drake Brockman as our leading run scorer. Matthew Bennison, Ollie Dabinett-Jays, Corey Perrett (and myself!) all chipped in with valuable runs also.

I want to say a huge thankyou to Sean Dobbs who's stepping down from the 1st XI captaincy after 3 seasons. Sean has brought through a young squad, giving them vital experience at that level. These young players are now ready to push the club forward. Thank you for all your dedication and devotion to the team Dobbsy.

A thank you and congratulations must also go to the GOAT, Matt Geffen, who hangs his bowling boots up (for now!) on an unbelievable 1<sup>st</sup> XI career.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> XI finished 5<sup>th</sup>, enjoying a much-improved season. A massive thankyou to Peter Lamb who is also stepping down as 2's captain next season. Lamby has galvanised the team after a really challenging 2021 and has guided his talented side to a comfortable mid table finish in division 5 in 2022.

The 3<sup>rd</sup> XI finished 2<sup>nd</sup> and were promoted to Division 6 West. A brilliant season for Graeme's 3's who have enjoyed back-to-back promotions. Their charge was led by Ben Hubbard's wealth of runs, supported by a magnificent crop of junior players, who no doubt will be knocking on the door of the first XI before we know it.

The 4<sup>th</sup> XI finished as champions, winning Division 11 West. Jez Goode's team featured some club legends alongside really promising younger players. The stalwarts gave some sparkling performances this year, such as David Baily's 171<sup>\*</sup> and 5 for in the same match!

The 5<sup>th</sup> XI finished 7<sup>th</sup>, a great improvement on last season and Tim's side again provided an opportunity for our younger juniors and girls to have a taste of competitive senior league cricket for the first time, which is the very purpose of this team.

Thank you to all the captains for all their efforts this season and for regularly pulling off some magic in getting 5 teams out on the park each weekend.

The full women's review will follow later in this report, but the club once again entered Women's teams in the Sussex softball competition and hardball Sussex Slam competition. The latter being a standalone CPPCC team for the first time. This shows the clubs progression from running a joint team with neighbours West Wittering in the previous season. We finished 4<sup>th</sup> in both competitions, competing well against vastly more experienced sides, who had many years of playing cricket together behind them.

Several of the women and girls have also enjoyed the opportunity to play mixed senior cricket in the  $4^{\rm th}$  &  $5^{\rm th}$  XIs.

The pace at which our women players are developing is phenomenal! They have a real enthusiasm to further develop their skills and we look forward to being able to enhance their opportunities in the coming year, building on the excellent foundations that Ben Gregory and Tom Drake-Brockman as coaches have provided this summer. As well as being a brilliant overseas player, Tom has been a great bloke to have around, being involved in all facets of the club.

James' junior report will follow, so I will not go into great detail, but as we have become accustomed to, CPPCC provided a summer full of great opportunities for local young people to take part in our sport and learn the game. We catered for All Stars (5-8 year olds) on a Friday night, the fantastic Dynamo Girls (8-12 year olds) on Mondays, and for all age groups continuing up to under 18.

Thank you to Sean Dobbs for leading the coaching and to all the coaches, junior managers and Friday night helpers. A special thank you to James Mayne for managing the largest section of the club and to Anna Davies for her administration and drive for the All Stars and Girls Dynamos, which started with a state school cricket festival, to encourage girls who may not have had chance to play cricket before to come and give it a go.

We have an ambition to grow women's and girls cricket, with a long term aim of providing girls teams at every age group, to feed into a full senior women's programme.

To do this we need the help of parents, friends and family, to all get involved and help out in any way you can.... from umpiring, scoring and coaching, to helping at social events; there is a voluntary opening for everybody. There is no need for any experience, just a will to help out. Please get in touch if you want to join the CPPCC army of volunteers in any capacity, to help run our club and push it forward. We are extremely grateful for any time that you can give.

The vision that the committee and I share for the club is about providing the best possible cricketing opportunities and experiences for all, at every age and level of the game. I think we are heading in a very positive direction and this season we had 99 adult male players, 34 adult women, 206 junior boys and 37 junior girls registered.

We will continue to invest in improving our own players, providing the best level of coaching and support that we can. It is also the Club's ambition to improve our playing, training and social facilities

and I thank Chichester District Council and Chichester City Council for their grant support to help us through the design phase for a new pavilion in Priory Park.

We have appointed Smith Simmons and Partners as planning consultants and Open Design Studio as architects, to bring forward a design for a new pavilion that is fit for purpose. They will navigate the heritage, conservation and ecological nuances which we are faced with in Priory Park as the design comes forward for planning application in 2023. I also really appreciate Alex Burrows' ongoing support on this project.

The club secured a £10,000 grant from the ECB and £10,000 from the Goodwood Estate this season, for which we are extremely grateful. This enabled the modernisation of the kitchen and toilet facilities at Goodwood Pavilion to create a more practical and welcoming environment. Thank you to Richard Geffen for his work in leading this and for his endless hours managing the ground at Goodwood and maintaining a great place to play.

We are also continually grateful for our unique alliance with Goodwood Cricket Club, that provides benefit to members of both clubs. We will continue to work together to seek out opportunities to provide the best cricketing opportunities and experiences for all.

I want to say thank you to all our sponsors; George Ide as junior section sponsors, Rathbones as women and girls sponsor and to Marchwood, Gardiner and Scardifield, CI Optometrists and of course, Goodwood Estate for all their ongoing support.

Their support enables us to run our existing programme of cricket and provides the opportunity to further grow. Their support is vital in the success of our club.

These sponsorship arrangements wouldn't be possible without Cathy Gregory's networking, leadership and management of our sponsorship arrangements and her work as club secretary. Thanks Cathy.

And as my final thank you, I want to recognise all our umpires, scorers and grounds team volunteers, and the tireless committee as a whole. You are all invaluable and without you we couldn't play the game we love.

Lastly, but by no means least, the committee would like to congratulate Andrew (Boss) Barnes for his Sussex Cricket Lifetime Achievement Award.

Andy and his amazing wife Jan have been figureheads of the club for decades. Between them they have held almost every committee position in their over 40 year connection with CPPCC.

Boss started playing in the early 60's, through until 2021, and has captained all 4 senior sides in that time. He was president for 6 years and currently umpires the 2<sup>nd</sup> XI every week as well as spending hours each week on the roller, helping the grounds team at Goodwood produce excellent playing surfaces.

Jan has been instrumental in various roles at the club; including as the club's welfare officer and membership officer. She has organised countless social events such as end of season celebrations. Jan's positive attitude has always ensured that the club provide the highest quality, safest environment for our young players to thrive. Jan can currently be found scoring every weekend for the 4s or 5s. Between them, this duo have given countless hours and years of their lives to the club. They have secured thousands of pounds through fundraising, and ensured that other people take as much joy from the game as they do. The club is immensely thankful and grateful for their lifetime of service.



I hope you have all enjoyed the 2022 season as much as I have. The hard work continues throughout the winter as we prepare for 2023, which looks like it's shaping up to be an exciting and successful year ahead.

### **Financial Report Summary**

- The club recorded a surplus of £3,048 for the year.
  - This more than offsets the £1,745 loss in the prior year.
- There have been several important financial events during the year:
  - We continued to advance discussions with CDC on the feasibility, design and costing of a substantial refurbishment of the White Pavilion.
    - We have received a grant of £2.5k from CDC and also a commitment from CDC to share costs 50/50 up to a total of £18k. As a result of these grants, we expect the cost to the club will be around £6k over 2 years.
    - The accounts include the £2.5k grant as revenue, £2.2k of cash costs and a further £3.5k provision with the result being that we will amortise the expected cost over 2 years.
    - We are very grateful to Smith & Simmons and the Open Design Studio for their continued assistance with the project and for agreeing to undertake the work at significantly reduced rates.
  - The club assisted with the refurbishment of the Goodwood club house kitchen through access to a £10k grant from the ECB.
  - The club increased membership fees and match fees for most categories this year which assisted in increasing revenue from subscriptions and match fees by around £4k vs the prior year.
  - We significantly increased our coaching budget this year to meet the increase demand from each of our juniors, ladies, and senior men segments.
  - $\circ$   $\;$  The club contributed £1.7k towards the new scoreboard at Goodwood.
  - $\circ$   $\,$  We received a £1,000 "inspired to play" grant from the ECB  $\,$
  - Two new sightscreens were delivered for Priory Park which were damaged last year and largely funded through insurance proceeds.
  - We purchased a Defibrillator for Priory Park
  - We are receiving the benefit of obtaining insurance cover through the ECB which substantially reduces our premium.
- The club has amble liquidity with around £38k in the bank.
- The support from the local business community through sponsorship is critical to the financial success of the club. Without their support, we would be unable to operate the club with our current subscription / match fee structure.
  - A special mention to our primary sponsors of Rathbones, George Ide, Goodwood Estate & Marchwood for their continued and very generous support.
  - We would also like to acknowledge our appreciation for the support from two new sponsors this year Gardner and Scardifield and CI Optometrists.
- Finally, thanks to the committee and team captains for all their efforts this year.

#### 1st XI - Season Report

A memorable summer of for the boys in which we played some outstanding cricket in one of the hottest and driest on record. There was an air of optimism after a good winter of recruitment as we welcomed Owen Millard and Ollie DJ into the fold, Tom Drake Brockman joined us as our overseas and the big bird Corey Perrett was now available for first team duty. The squad had a youthful and energetic feel, and we couldn't wait to get started.

An unbeaten pre-season, and a resounding victory in the first round of the T20 set us up nicely for the league campaign and there was some excellent performances both as a team and individually. The highlight of the early weeks was the performance against West Chilts, an 8 wicket, chasing 160 odd with a brilliant partnership from TDB and Matty B seeing us home. Geff and Corey had torn up their much-lauded top order to leave them at 20/4 at one stage.

We then struggled for a while, the change to declaration cricket didn't help us with flat wickets, lightning outfields, and a very competitive division, we struggled to force wins. Our batting, which was a huge issue in 2021 was now our strength, where previously we struggled to reach 200, it was now a shock if we didn't, and big scores happened regularly. We passed 300 in 45 overs against Findon and throughout the season no less than 7 of our batters passed 300 league runs.

It was during the middle period of the season that I resigned the captaincy. Being asked to skipper the 1st XI will go down as one of my proudest sporting achievements. Knowing when your time is up is not the easiest to acknowledge, the progress our young batters were making and the huge improvement in others meant there was no longer a place in the team for me. When Deej scored a hundred for the 2s, which we were following on play cricket, it was obvious to me I would be holding a young player back. The decision to drop myself hopefully showed that the team and the club ALWAYS comes first.

My last game of 1st XI cricket ended in the back of Mikeys van on the way to St Richards, those that know my sporting history and body will be in no way surprised that injury had the final say. As I woke from the anaesthetic, my first and only thought was the cricket. A quick FaceTime to the boys and the news that Timmy had scored a maiden league ton and a big one at that to bring home the points put a huge smile on my face, well that combined with the morphine anyway.

As a team we drew too many games in that middle period and a heavy defeat at Findon actually meant we were flirting with danger at one point. We also had to overcome the huge loss of the big bird as he moved to Australia to start a new job. Corey as a bloke and a cricketer was immense. Off the field he was a regular at our junior sessions and the kids loved him, on the field he was a colossus. 330 runs, 22 wickets and 10 catches in just over half a season are numbers that top overseas cricketers are paid for. His hat trick at St James and the 6 he hit in pre-season against Middleton are two of my favourite highlights. I wasn't there for 'the catch' against Lindfield but the boys assured me it's one of the best they've seen.

I saw plenty of the remaining games and without the pressure of me trying to justify my place in the side, I enjoyed watching. Seeing lads that have come through our youth system performing with excellence and consistency. Matt Bennison is a player I admire in so many ways, he goes under the radar but he's very good. Plays his role to perfection and if you cut him open, he bleeds Chi. He's involved in so many brilliant partnerships and usually in a secondary role but he's such a vital part of the team.

A move back to the limited overs format bought about a change in our fortunes and meant we finished in a very comfortable mid table position. TDB and Grego's partnership away at eventual champions Cuckfield, which I watched almost ball by ball from a villa in Spain was incredible. The diminutive Aussie with plenty of 'Ticka' was everything you'd want from an overseas cricketer. Brilliant off the field and a superb all-rounder on it, his fitness levels and professionalism were a great example to our young players. 500 runs and 30 plus wickets was an excellent return, a huge thank you from both me and the club.

His partner in crime is another huge success story. Grego came with me through the 2s and is now one of the first names on the team sheet. Eyebrows were raised when I pronounced him as the quickest bowler in the club during pre-season, but by the end of it he'd proved himself as one of the quickest in the division. He's a champion bloke is Grego, superb value in fines sessions and will eventually take over from Geff as the leader of the attack.

During the run in we saw yet more individual hundreds. Deej scored what will be the first of many in a match saving unbeaten ton against St Peters, and Mikey got his maiden league century against St James. Mikey had a brilliant breakthrough season, with the responsibility of opening, his undoubted talent shone through. There is no doubt in my mind that this should be the norm for him, he's also a very handy Vanbulance driver!

The best of the lot was that man Timmy again. His unbeaten 140 against Haywards Heath, which was recognised as a very good attack, was simply breath-taking. For an 18 year old to score two 140\* 's in a month is ridiculous and if he stays with us he'll break all the records.

The final mention goes to the GOAT. After sixteen years of sustained excellence he has decided to hang up his boots. I think everyone hopes he misses it and reverses his decision, but he has very much earned the right to retire on his terms. In these modern times of instant gratification, his loyalty to the club means every bit as much as each of this 350 odd first team wickets. Thanks for everything Geffa, you will be sorely missed.

We finished up in 6th place with over 300 points in a tough league, with more victories, less defeats and more runs than the previous season. This group led by our new skipper have the talent to take us back to the big league and compete and I have no doubt they will.

My remit was to bring through a talented group of lads and nurture them into a team and hopefully I've achieved that. I've loved having the honour of being their captain and look forward to watching from afar, what happens next. Up the Chi.

### 2nd XI - Season Report

The 2021 Cricket Season proved to be extremely challenging for the 2<sup>nd</sup> XI and despite some close matches we finished the season with just two wins and were subsequently relegated to Division 5 West which was disappointing for the whole Club and particularly for me personally but we began the 2022 season with renewed enthusiasm and confidence and the pre-season games went very much to plan and enabled some of our budding young talent to be blooded ready for the start the league matches.

Rehan Meiring and Ed McCarthy leading the run scoring with 472 & 385 respectively, with a fantastic 100 from Oli DJ against Horsham and equally important contributions from Harry Walker, Johnny Heaven, Jimmy Wild, Owen Spicer and others all bodes well for next season.

I'm sure there have been some interesting conversations in the Mayne household with both Stanley and James both finishing on 22 2<sup>nd</sup> XI wickets for the season and Stanley getting his first 2nd team 5-for with his performances improving year on year, 2023 should prove an interesting season. Another new recruit later in the season, Hassan Juniad was impressive adapting to taking the new ball and finishing the season with 19 wickets including a fantastic spell of 5/22.

Toby Toft, Jimmy Wild, Rehan Meiring, and Martin Ford, had wicket tally's into double figures all making significant contributions throughout the season.

We have strategically set out our 3s as the steppingstone for our junior players to prepare for the jump to our 1s and 2s.

To facilitate this, we have needed a strong spine to allow our younger players to develop in a less pressured environment knowing that they are supported in terms of their performances by senior players who will help and guide, but who are also able to deliver performances which have enabled the team to be competitive. The first half of the season was particularly challenging, as we struggled with availability, no longer having the benefit of our university students working from home, and GCSE and A level students studying for exams. However, despite the challenges, we managed to field competitive teams most weeks.

The senior spine I mentioned earlier provided great support:

- Saqib Khushnood, new to the club this season, taking 15 wkts
- Guy Montgomery despite absence/injury 12 wkts
- However, there were many other significant contributions, sharing the wicket taking around, supported by excellent fielding
- Our two wicket keepers were the envy of the league Glen Stanford (senior) and Arran Goode (junior)
- Our batting spine led by Alex Burrows and supported by Greg French and Glen Stanford, performed week on week, setting challenging targets as we batted first most weeks. As the season progressed the junior contributions increased, with maiden 50s from Tom Baily, James Connolly and Freddie Gillet

• However, we couldn't have put games out of reach if it hadn't been for our No. 3 batsman and player of the season Ben Hubbard, scoring 591 runs @ 65.67 with HS 135\*

We have had a great season and are looking forward to putting pressure on the teams in Div 6 in 2023.

Finally, I would like to thank Mike Dannatt for his continued support, working on his own most weeks. His umpiring goes from strength to strength, and it's great to know that we have him around every week.
