We have made the incredibly difficult decision to reduce to 4 senior men's league teams in 2024. Team entries are reviewed each season, and this is not a permanent decision. The basis for this proposal is the ongoing difficulty of player availability and strain on selection process over the last few years, coupled with ever increasing ground availability pressures.

Unfortunately, it is not viable for us to sustain 5 league sides with the volume of players who are only available for a handful of matches each season. For these more infrequent players, we will continue to provide opportunities, through the fantastic midweek slam team (a big thanks to Rob Carver for his brilliant captaincy of this side this year!) and we are very open to anybody coming forward to manage any additional friendly fixtures.

I can confirm that the fourth team will continue the ethos of the 'chives' in providing an entry level and nurturing team environment for players commencing senior cricket.

Thank you to everyone for 2023, I hope you have a great winter and I look forward to exciting times ahead in 2024 and beyond.

## Financial Report Summary

- The club recorded a surplus of £1,503 for the year.
- We submitted our pre-planning application for the refurbishment of the White Pavilion.
  - Whilst the response was broadly positive, CDC were concerned about the large size of the proposed building. CDC do understand there are some constraints from the ECB and discussions are ongoing.
  - The accounts include the monies paid by the club, the 50% fee rebate which has been paid by CDC and an existing provision of £2k for expected additional costs.

- We are very grateful to Smith & Simmons and the Open Design Studio for their continued assistance with the project and for agreeing to undertake the work at significantly reduced rates.
- The club’s revenues across subscriptions, match fees are sponsorship were broadly in line with the budget and last year’s figures.
  - A particular highlight was the increasing numbers of young girls joining the club through the Dynamos program.
- Ground hire costs increased materially this year due to:
  - Greater use of Tangmere.
  - Increased use of Priory Park and an increase in hire charges. CDC also erroneously under-charged us last year which makes the difference with this year look larger.
  - Higher maintenance costs for Keepers Green vs last year.
- We had higher expenses relating to the club subsidising the purchase of new coloured clothing for the women’s & men’s 1<sup>st</sup> XI this year. This is shown under “training kit”.
- There were no significant purchases of equipment (and no corresponding grants) this year which resulted in equipment expenditure being lower than last year. Next year we may need to replace sight screens in Priory Park and/or assist with the maintenance of the nets at Bishop Luffa.
- The club has ample liquidity with around £39k in the bank.
- The support from the local business community through sponsorship is critical to the financial success of the club. Without their support, we would be unable to operate the club with our current subscription / match fee structure.
  - A special mention to our sponsors of Rathbones, George Ide, Goodwood Estate, Marchwood, Gardner and Scardifield, CI Optometrists, Tod Anstee & Wedge Fish for their continued and very generous support.
- Finally, thanks to the committee and team captains for all their efforts this year.

## 1st XI - Season Report

Another summer rolled around quickly, and the fellas played some very solid cricket throughout. There was a fantastic buzz around the camp heading into the first game against Worthing. After losing some out and out first team players from the previous season, we welcomed George Briance as captain and Jack Dawling who would take the gloves for the season. Mitch Heyward, a big, tall fast bowler from Geelong, Victoria joined us as the club's overseas player for the season.

Mitch added pace up the top of the innings and some firepower down the lower end of the batting order finishing the season with 35 league wickets @ an average of 16, which included 3 x five-wicket hauls. For me, Mitch was a fantastic role model for the juniors and up and coming seamer's around the club, giving up his time week in and week out to help them get better whilst also creating a great atmosphere with his presence.

After a steady start to the season, we had won all 4 of our home fixtures, making Goodwood a tough place to come for away teams. Some highlights of these wins were a gritty 50 vs Brighton by the youngest chairman ever, Hasty! GB consistently picking up scalps throughout this period which included 2 3fers and a match winning 80.

Declaration cricket came around and this is where we started to face a few challenges, however the grit and determination of some of the boys during this period will be remembered for a long time to come. After losing the toss we were sent into field on a flatty and also a 30+ degree day vs Hastings. Mitch picked up his first five -wicket haul of the season. Special mention to Timmy and myself, for having a club record 1XI partnership of 204 in difficult circumstances. Which almost led to us chasing down Hastings total of 287.

During this period, we also saw the introduction of some new faces to the team. After successful stints in the 2<sup>nd</sup> XI, county and respective school sides, we saw Tom Baily, Freddie Gillett, James Connolly and Lewis Hawes come into the side at least once. All of these boys bought a great amount of energy, contributed to the team and added a great atmosphere to the camp.

In the middle part of the season, we had some bad luck. Getting rained off at crucial times in the season against Brighton who we were strong favourites to beat, also Haywards Heath who we fancied ourselves against with a weaker side. Unavailability along with some other things led to us flirting with that relegation zone. Credit to everyone who played in those last 4 games of the season. Each and every player knew what was on the line, everyone gave 110% for the club and the buzz, intensity and enjoyment we had during that last month together was something I'll never forget.

During that period, we also saw some of our young and talented guns step up to the table. Tom Baily coming on to dismiss Crowhurst Parks number 3 straight away after hitting 45 off 20 odd balls, to then bowl his 9 overs for 24 was a spell of bowling that can't go unnoticed. Harry Walker taking the new ball at 16, arguably bowling some of the quickest opening spells in that league, shaking up batters that are twice his age. Freddie Gillett making his 1s debut at a very difficult time, not having any chance to settle and take in the opportunity. He had 2 crucial small knocks to balance the innings in his first 2 games and also got handed the new ball. For a



15-year-old to come in and create an atmosphere and perform with that kind of pressure on his shoulders is something he should be very proud of.

After posting 126 against Crowhurst on a small ground, we thought we could be in for a very long drive home. Shoutout to the skipper that day George, taking responsibility and blowing the Crowhurst Park batting orders pads off. Finishing with 5/4. A superb display. Then again, another senior player stepping up when we need them most, Mitchy taking 5/29 against Buxted.

After winning the final 2 games before the last game, the boys put themselves in a position to keep the club alive in Division 2. Burgess Hill away, the last game of the season. Myself and George put us in a healthy position with 60 odd each with another crucial knock from Tom Baily of 27. We set a healthy but not overly convincing total of 216. After an early wicket by Harry and a run out from Timmy, we were in with a sniff. However, form is temporary, and class is permanent. This showed when Burgess Hill's overseas Prasansana Jayamanne hit a match winning 84\* to steer the home side to victory on the last day. Meaning we were relegated to Division 3.

As Vice-Captain of the 1XI, I would like to thank every player who stepped onto the park this season, it was tough, but the grit and determination of you guys when it wasn't easy, showed a lot about the characters we have at this cricket club. Big shoutout to the fellow senior players in the side. Hasty, Mikey, Mitch, Benno and Dawling. The constant reassuring example set and leadership you boys showed this season also shows why this club has really healthy future. A massive thank you to Cathy for travelling home and away with us to score this year, we deeply appreciate your help, also to Lucas, Elliot and Jan for stepping in!

Although it was tough, the vibe that was created and the memories made were unforgettable. Watching this talented group of cricketers come through this year was great to watch, no doubt CPPCC will be bouncing straight back up into Division 2 in no time.

## 2nd XI - Season Report

The 2<sup>nd</sup> XI went into the season with a high level of optimism that all being well with availability, they would have a fantastic chance of getting back to Division 4. On paper the team looked really strong, and it was frustrating that the first fixture with West Chilt was cancelled due to a wet outfield on the first sunny day of the summer. This was followed by another rain day which avoided a trip to Worthing. The season finally got started with another fixture with West Chilt and a comfortable home victory. Charlie Futcher made 58 and Stanley Mayne took 5 for 48.

Pagham away was challenging and from 47 for 5 the team got to a respectable 217 for 9. Owen Millard scored a swashbuckling 75 off 53 balls and Louis Gibbons 45 off 37. Pagham got closer than they perhaps should have with 198, but a good game was slightly marred by some controversial umpiring decisions and a rowdy Pagham crowd.

Barns Green will always go down as a disappointing loss after excellent batting got us to 236 for 6 off the 40. James Connolly with his maiden senior ton of 102. A slightly frustrating day with the ball, on a belter of a pitch, enabled Barns Green to get home in the last over.

The next two games with Horsham Trinity and Rustington followed similar patterns with the 2s batting first and putting 250 on the board. Pressure on the opposition with some disciplined bowling was enough to come out comfortable winners. Ram is best forgotten as a bad day at the office on a terrible pitch, but normal service was resumed with a good run chase against Findon after a professional display.

Crawley Eagles folded under some decent seam bowling from Caleb and Lewis and a smallish total was chased down with ease.

Worthing in the Park proved to a pivotal moment in the season. 247 off 40 overs with good contributions throughout should have been comfortably enough, but a difficult afternoon in the field kept Worthing in it. In the end the team pulled out what was required in a tight finish and came out winners by 7 runs. It felt like a big win and so it proved.

After that there was sufficient momentum and belief to keep winning matches and no opposition gave us too much trouble. Barns Green were blown away on a poor pitch. Freddie G taking 4 for 5. A couple of washouts was frustrating. An awkward match at Rustington with lots of regulars missing didn't stop us (Dominic with 80) and then Findon, Ram (Lewis 5 for 22) and Crawley Eagles were beaten comfortably.

We played as a team throughout with very few stand out performances, but everyone understanding and performing the role they were given. Sean led the run scoring with Ed Mac and 11 players scored more than 100 runs. Fordy was immense every time he played as was the contributions from Johnny Heaven, Charlie Futcher, and Rehan. We bowled very well as a unit and were led by Lewis Hawes (24) who developed something of a golden arm in the



second half of the season and Stanley Mayne (19) who bowled consistently well and was probably unlucky not to take more wickets. Louis Gibbons was a great addition to the team as was Matt Croker for the last few games. Caleb did a great job with the new ball. Toby did well when not required by the 1s and James Mayne was always good for a big wicket when required. Arran got himself a 50 and kept brilliantly throughout the season. Freddie G and Dominic also showed great promise and made telling contributions.

### **3<sup>rd</sup> XI - Season Report**

After successive promotions 2023 was always likely to prove a tougher season with 3s playing just one division below 2s. However, at the halfway stage of the season we were top (having played one more game), unfortunately the weather intervened when with strong teams, we missed the opportunity to surprise the title challengers.

The lack of bowling strength in the two games vs Bognor proved to be our undoing. However, we finished a creditable 5<sup>th</sup>, and posed a serious threat to the top teams. This season we fielded 40 players of which 10 played only 1 game.

The spine of our team is made of 5/6 senior players and our ambition is to enjoy our Saturdays and prepare our exciting juniors for more senior adult cricket. To that end this year eight U16s have played for the team across the season.

The weather conditions proved more challenging than in 2022. Although performing consistently this season as a team, there have been few significant milestones, but Johnny (Boom Boom) Maynard has continued to improve his off-spin bowling, taking 15 wickets in his 8 appearances with a best of 4/26, as ever Guy Montgomery was his consistent self and we had excellent contributions from James Mayne, Saqib Khushnood and David Briance, all providing the senior bowling spine for the younger bowlers to bowl around.

From the batting side again, major contributions came from Ben Hubbard (396) and following injury, Peter Lamb made a massive impact in 5 innings (197).

Thank you for the help from the other members of our selection committee who have ensured that we balance our teams to provide the best experiences for our players, whilst putting out our strongest and most balanced teams.

I would also like to thank Mike Dannatt (Umpire) and Wes Hardingham (scorer) for their support throughout the season.

## 4th XI - Season Report

The 2023 season was a mixed of bag. Several factors contributed to the team dropping into the lower League for the 2024 season.

1. The weather was against us as those matches abandoned, were against lesser capable teams (who ended up with less points than us and being relegated), arguably I am sure, we would have won, thus increasing our overall points tally at the end of the season.
2. We snatched defeat from the jaws of victory losing three matches in the last over! Fantastic matches to watch by those non-partisan bystanders, but it was so frustrating how we succumbed and lost, giving valuable points away to the opposition.
3. Poor availability throughout the season meant that we did not have a core nucleus of players playing each week. To be competitive and to stay in the League we needed a committed number of players playing consistently each week for the team. Overall, we used 38 players of which only 7 players played more than 6 matches throughout the entire season. Only 3 players played more than 10 matches.

We really need more commitment & need a set of core players to play in the team week in, week out. This provides consistency, which brings confidence, bonds players, and ultimately creates a great team spirit.

Out of those 38 players, 17 players were under the age 18; of those 11 players were under the age of 16. This is truly a fantastic achievement by every one of them and not one looked out of place, holding their own playing adult league cricket.

Whilst at times the going was tough in some matches, nevertheless the challenge that our younger ones will have experienced will make them far stronger and more resilient when they play in future matches, that are equally as intense, tight, and highly pressured. Subconsciously they will have benefitted and learnt so much from these situations, which will make them better future cricketers in seasons to come.

It also shows the strength and depth of our excellent junior section that feeds our senior teams up through the years.

There were some superb performances throughout the season and valuable contributions made.

Shiv Naik top scored a fine 97\* being robbed of a century by his skipper against Chippendales. The conditions were so windy no one could hear the scorer shout that Shiv was so close to his 100 before the winning runs were hit to secure the victory. Shiv will go on to make more centuries, I'm sure...

Other notable top five batting contributions were D Baily 398 runs, average of 56.86; D. Graham-Wood 247 runs, average of 30.88; S. Gillett 189 runs, average of 27; Mo Islam 154 runs, average 25.67 and Alex Burrows 134 runs, average of 44.67.

Some very good partnerships were made by some excellent batting. D Graham-Wood and Mo Islam put on 160 against Roffey CC and old boys D Baily and S Gillett put on 135 v Petworth Park 1<sup>st</sup> XI.

Our bowling attack primarily came from our juniors. They showed enormous spirit and determination with some outstanding bowling figures. Oscar Pitman 14 wkts and best 4/16 against Ifield; Finlay Rustell 8 wkts and 4/7 against Kilnwood Vale; Jamie Edwards 8 wkts and best bowling 2/8 and not forgetting veteran allrounders D. Connolly with best 4/50 against Kilnwood Vale and Paul Walker, snaffling 14 wickets with his deceptive spin bowling with best bowling of 4/27, also against Kilnwood Vale. Paul's contribution with bat also was very valued, especially at times when we were staring down the barrel.

Our player of the year was unanimous and without doubt. A student at the University Mo came to us this summer to play cricket and how well he has settled in. Not only a good all-round guy, but Mo was also our best bowler by far and was always my go to bowler when I needed a wicket or two. He did tell me he was an opener and did the team proud by scoring 78 runs against Roffey at the beginning of the season. However, where he came into his own was his off-spin bowling. Mo was our highest wicket taker taking 20 wkts in the season with best bowling figures of 5/36 against Chippendales and 5/39 against Pagham.

Accordingly, Mo was our player of the season winning the 4<sup>th</sup> XI Chris Hooker award. Many congratulations go to Mo.

My thanks also go as ever to Bryan Tomalin, Malcolm Lamb, Tim Pitman and Bruce Ruddock for their help umpiring during the season and Steve Darby for assisting with scoring.

Lastly as always, my thanks go to the Committee who work so hard behind the scenes throughout the year to ensure that this Club provides as best as practicably possible an opportunity for all its members to play cricket in arguably two of the finest quintessential settings one could ever ask to play, that of Goodwood and Priory Park. We do need more volunteers to help support the club and I would urge new faces to come along and help volunteer their services.
